

## ORDINANCE NO. 2002 - 29

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF TALTY, TEXAS, ABOLISHING THE OFFICE OF TOWN MARSHAL, AND CONFERRING THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICE ON THE SHERIFF OF KAUFMAN COUNTY, TEXAS, PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND, PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF TALTY, TEXAS:**

**SECTION 1.** That the Board of Aldermen find that the Town of Talty is a Type B general law city and has a population of less than 5,000.

**SECTION 2.** That the office of Town Marshal be and the same is hereby abolished, effective as of the effective date hereof.

**SECTION 3.** That the duties of the office of Town Marshal are hereby conferred on the Sheriff of Kaufman County, Texas, or on such law enforcement agency or duly sworn peace officer as may now or hereafter be approved by the Board of Aldermen.

**SECTION 4.** That all ordinances of the Town of Talty in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed and all other ordinances of the Town of Talty not in conflict with the provisions of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 5.** That if any section, paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase or provision of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid and shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance or any other provision of the ordinances of the Town of Talty.

**SECTION 6.** That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage as the law in such cases provides.
